

What is Hemophilia?

You may have heard hemophilia referred to as the “Bleeder’s Disease.” Adults and children with this condition and similar bleeding disorders experience frequent, lifelong bleeding episodes due to a lack of clotting factor in their blood. People with bleeding disorders can face persistent challenges, secondary health issues, and daily living obstacles. Treatment involves regularly infusing the missing clotting factor into the bloodstream. Bleeding disorders—like hemophilia—are lifelong conditions that can affect anyone. Treatments, which can cost \$10,000 a month or more, can never be stopped. To date, there is no cure.

What is KHF?

Kentucky Hemophilia Foundation (KHF) is the Kentucky Chapter of the National Hemophilia Foundation. We are a private, non-profit organization established in 1960 as a support system for families affected by hemophilia and similar bleeding disorders. The changes brought about by learning your child has a chronic condition are life altering. Having a support system that is there for you along a lifelong journey with a bleeding disorder is vitally important. Since our incorporation, KHF has grown into a statewide health agency serving Kentucky’s bleeding disorders community.
